2 Primary Schools and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs received laptop computers and a Printer from the Government of Chile.

Meanwhile the principal of the St. Pauls Government School, Anthea Peterkin receiving 3 laptop computers on behalf of her school promised to make the very best use of the computers.

She said their ICT program started a few years ago were unable to continue because of the lack of computers and is delighted the students will get the opportunity to be reintroduced to the world of ICT.

The final stop in computer distribution was at the ministerial complex where the Ministry of Foreign Affairs received 4 laptop computers.

Foreign Affairs Minister Honourable Karl Hood receiving the computers on behalf of the Ministry said the computers would be used to maximize mobility and efficiency of the ministry and assured Ambassador Pradel the computers would be put into the very best use as the ministry strive to deliver quality foreign service.
